Federal Fuel Charge Procedure on NGTL – For Intra-Alberta Points Only

Pursuant to the Greenhouse Gas Pollution Pricing Act (GGPPA), as of January 1, 2020, NGTL is required to collect the Federal Fuel Charge (FFC) on applicable intra-Alberta deliveries under any rate schedule, including D2, D3, and any other intra-Alberta delivery services.

NGTL will collect the FFC at applicable intra-Alberta delivery locations unless Customer obtains an exemption certificate and provides the required documentation to NGTL. In order to have NGTL apply an exemption from the FFC, Customer must provide NGTL with documentation of a valid exemption certificate and written notice for locations to which the exemption applies which notifies NGTL that the location is exempt from the FFC. Notwithstanding any such exemption, Customer shall be liable to and shall indemnify and hold harmless NGTL for any expenses, costs (including legal costs on a solicitor and his own client basis), taxes, levies, charges, penalties or interest which may be incurred by or assessed against NGTL as a result of NGTL exempting Customer from the FFC.

If at any time a Customer's location no longer meets the exemption criteria or an exemption certificate is no longer valid, Customer shall immediately provide written notice to NGTL of such change.

Absent a valid exemption certificate, NGTL will collect the current applicable FFC as set by the Canada Revenue Agency pursuant to the GGPPA on all applicable gas deliveries. The FFC is effective January 1, 2020 and will appear on the first invoices to be issued by NGTL commencing on February 20th, 2020.
